- » Working Families First Credit. Proposed by Sec. Julián Castro, 2020 presidential candidate. ITEP estimates.
- » Economic Agenda for Working Families. Proposed by Pete Buttigieg, 2020 presidential candidate. ITEP estimates.
- » Other proposals by 2020 presidential candidates. Mayor Mike Bloomberg has proposed expanding the EITC to include family caregivers and workers without children, and provide a monthly payment option. Sen. Michael Bennet has proposed a significant EITC increase for workers without children, and was a leading sponsor of the Working Families Tax Relief Act, which is co-sponsored by Sens. Booker, Harris, Klobuchar, Sanders, and Warren, and endorsed by 2020 presidential candidate Tom Steyer.
